Diana Good

Diana Good is both the Chair of the Board of the Mary Ward Settlement and a trustee of the Mary Ward Legal Centre. She has a part-time judicial appointment and was until 2008 a partner of Linklaters LLP global law firm. She retired from the City after 30 years with the firm. She is co-author of Linklaters' 2010 report for Camfed (Campaign for Education of Girls in sub-Saharan Africa) 'Accounting to the Girl: Working towards a standard for governance in the international aid sector'.



Caro Millington

Caro Millington's career as a broadcaster spanned nearly thirty years at the BBC, initially as a radio and television producer and subsequently as a manager. She became Controller of Production for BBC Radio, and Controller, Multimedia across BBC Radio and Television. She then spent some years as a non-executive director with the NHS, serving as Chair of the North West London Strategic Health Authority until 2007. Caro first attended classes at the Mary Ward Centre in 2003, taking the Access into Art course from 2005-7. In 2008 she became a trustee of the Mary Ward Settlement and then one of the Settlement Board's two Vice-chairs. She currently chairs the Quality, Equality and Curriculum Committee. Caro completed her BA in Fine Art at London Metropolitan University in June 2010.



Ros Mills

Ros trained at King's College Hospital, where she worked as a nursing sister, gaining experience in clinical work, management and teaching. She retired from nursing to concentrate on family life but continued to play a role in the local community, becoming involved in a number of community outreach projects concerned with issues of loneliness and isolation in young mothers, children and the homeless. She has been involved with the Mary Ward Centre since 1999, firstly as a student, studying history, art and history of philosophy, when she was elected as a student trustee. She is currently a Vice-chair of the Settlement and Chair of the Nominations Committee.
