

## **DIGITAL MEDIA (VIDEO) - TUTOR APPOINTMENTS**

### GENERAL INFORMATION

The Digital Media Section offers a range of part-time courses for adults including Video production, Photography, Photoshop, Web Design & DTP. A full-time Head of Programme manages the department.

The Mary Ward Centre is housed in two interconnecting listed Georgian houses overlooking Queen Square. The atmosphere is relaxed and friendly but purposeful. Students come from all walks of life, local, London wide and beyond. Their education, work and life experience varies enormously. Some students do not have English as their first language. The Centre has a full programme of other courses, including English and Other Languages, Computing and IT, Music, Health, Humanities, Personal Development, Arts and Crafts and Digital Media.

The rate of pay per hour is £26.68 (without a teaching qualification)-£27.99 (with a teaching qualification). Please note that if you do not have a teaching qualification you will need substantial teaching experience at AE level and be expected to obtain one during your first year of teaching.

### Vacancies:

#### **Introduction to Digital Video**

There are 6 session daytime courses of 6hrs per meeting (not including 1hr lunch break):

Saturday 25th September to 30th October, 10.30-17.30

Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> November to 11<sup>th</sup> December, 10.30-17.30

12 session evening course:

Thursdays 23rd September to 9th December 18.00 to 20.30

This course is for adult beginners with little or no digital video experience. They will learn the basic skills via a group project and be introduced to Premiere Pro as the editing software. Students work will need to be monitored and assessed throughout the course.

#### **Video Editing**

This is a 6 session course of 3hrs per meeting:

from Saturday 25 Feb to 2 April, 10.30-13.30

from Friday 5 Nov to 10 Dec 18.00 – 20.30

This course is for adults with some experience of using video who wish to concentrate on editing techniques using Premiere Pro.

Students work will need to be monitored and assessed throughout the course.

#### **Creative Video**

This is a 4 session course of 6hrs per meeting (not including 1hr lunch break) running in term 3 of our academic year:

From Saturday 7 May to 4 June, 10.30-17.30.

This course is for adults with some experience of digital video. They will make of creative videos in small production groups and use Premiere Pro as the editing software.

We expect a creative approach to delivering the course including discussions of resulting work as well as delivering skills in a range of ways possibly for exhibition purposes. Students will have been advised that they need some knowledge of Digital Video and Premiere Pro before applying for the course.

Students work will need to be monitored and assessed throughout the course.

### JOB DESCRIPTION

The Tutor will be expected to:-

1. Take responsibility for devising a suitable course and lesson plans.
2. Teach the course
3. Devise methods of working that will suit all students.
4. Monitor and evaluate students' progress.
5. Undertake administrative tasks to support the course e.g. record keeping, course documentation etc.

### PERSON SPECIFICATION

The successful applicant will:-

1. Be skilled in the use of Video or a practising artist.
2. Hold a teaching qualification or have substantial adult education teaching experience and be prepared to acquire one during the first year of the post.
3. Have relevant experience in teaching or leading groups of adults. We are particularly interested in tutors who will encourage a creative and imaginative approach.
4. Have the following teaching skills:
  - a well thought out course plan
  - an ability to work with mixed ability and mixed level groups
  - good strategies for monitoring and evaluating student progress
  - good communication skills
